


HOME

Co-writer and Director Calgary, November 2024

Home was a play co-written and directed by me. This absurd show draws inspiration from Kafka's novels and tells the story of a woman whose house is invaded by a family seeking to prove their claim to this home. The play addressed the issue of colonization and was performed in Calgary in November 2024. I used the Brechtian technique in this show to help audiences think more about its concept, and fortunately, we received terrific feedback from audiences for this show.

Writer, Director and Actor Calgary and Edmonton, October - November 2024
















EMPTY ROOM

Playwright, Director and Stage Designer Calgary, May 2024

In May 2024, after three months of intensive rehearsals, I successfully led a comedy show titled "Empty Room" at cSPACE Marda Loop in Calgary, Canada. As the playwright, stage designer, and director, I created this play inspired by the works of Neil Simon. Collaborating with a talented cast of 11 actors, we performed to an enthusiastic audience of over 400. This project highlighted my skills in creative writing, theatrical direction, and stage design, demonstrating my ability to bring a vision to life and engage large audiences through comedy.






THIRTEEN

Writer and Director Calgary, September 2023

In September 2023, I served as writer and director for Absence in Calgary, a unique production born from collaboration among Canadian and immigrant artists. This experimental laboratory theatre piece, structured as a fashion show sans dialogue, provocatively explored capitalism's impact on contemporary society, compellingly interrogating its effects.

























GREEN KEY

Facilitator and Director Calgary, February 2023

In 2023, I assumed the roles of facilitator and director for Green Key in Calgary, a poignant exploration of refugee experiences. Premiering at the University of Calgary in February, it later graced the stages of the Ignite Festival in July 2023 and the Chinook Festival in February 2024. This Applied Theater piece, featuring seven Canadian actors, engaged audiences in participatory experiences, guiding them through immersive spaces to foster empathy and understanding towards the refugee plight.







ROOM NO. 3


Writer and Director Calgary, April 2022

In April 2022, *Room No. 3* captivated audiences in Tehran's Molavi Hall with 30 riveting performances. As the writer, director, and stage designer, I crafted a compelling narrative exploring themes of immortality, drawing inspiration from Martin McDonough's characters. After nine months of rehearsal, our talented ensemble of 14 actors brought this fascinating story to life, impacting over 5,000 spectators.


















LIFE

Director, Stage Designer and Performer Tehran, July 2021


In July 2021, in Tehran's Ruberu Hall, I had the privilege of directing, stage designing, and performing in Zendegani (Life). Inspired by Marina Abramovic's "The Artist Is Present," this performance art piece centered on Afghan immigrants in Iran. With a team of four performers, including myself, we fluidly exchanged roles on different days, creating a dynamic and immersive experience that delved into the complexities of life and migration.



HISTORICITY (SHORT FILM)

Director and Screenwriter Tehran, June 2020

In June 2020, in Damavand City, Iran, I directed and wrote the screenplay for the short film *Historicity*. Leading a team of 23 cast and crew, including 11 cast members, we successfully filmed a 16-minute piece in a single day, designed to appear as a seamless "one-shot" sequence. With a focus on feminism and the portrayal of women in history, the screenplay was crafted with skill and sensitivity, aiming to provoke thought and inspire dialogue.



60 MINUTES MINUS ONE

Director and Dramaturge Tehran, December 2019

In December 2019, I was director and dramaturge for 60 Minutes Minus One in Tehran's Divar Chaharom Hall. Following six months of intensive rehearsal, this production, inspired by Arthur Miller's *The Ride Down Mt. Morgan*, ingeniously transformed into a condensed 60-minute play. Focusing on the final hour of the protagonist's life, we navigated themes of mortality and introspection, offering a compelling and poignant exploration of the human experience.
















A MEMORY OF TWO MONDAYS

Director and Dramaturge Tehran, August 2019

In August 2019, at Tehran's Shahrzad Hall, I undertook the roles of director and dramaturge for "A Memory of Two Mondays." Over a meticulous nine-month period, I conducted individual rehearsals with each of the 11 actors, ensuring their distinctiveness to enhance character authenticity. Drawing inspiration from Arthur Miller's play, this production delved deep into the complexities of human relationships.























50/50

Actor Tehran, February 2019

In February 2019, I had the honor of acting in 50/50 at Tehran's Hillaj Hall, directed by Morteza Esmaeil. Portraying a bilingual character, navigating Persian and German lines without prior knowledge of German was a challenge I embraced. My character embodied dual identities, representing both an Auschwitz prisoner and "Iberin" from Bertolt Brecht's Round Heads and Pointed Heads. Throughout the production, I engaged in ongoing negotiations with the writer to shape the Brechtian script. With over 10,000 audience members in attendance, the show left a lasting impact.



ACTING WORKSHOP FOR THE IRANIAN COMMUNITY

Calgary, February-April 2023

I facilitated an intensive Acting Workshop tailored for the Iranian community in Calgary, Alberta. Over 70 hours were dedicated to honing their craft, delving into the methodologies of renowned practitioners, including David Mamet, Stella Adler, Konstantin Stanislavski, Vsevolod Meyerhold, and Michael Chekhov. Through rigorous exploration and practice, participants gained invaluable insight into the art of acting, fostering creativity and skill development within the community.
